



# St Peter's College Gore

## Costs 2010

St Peter's College is an integrated state school, so tuition fees are not charged.

### **Attendance Dues**

Attendance Dues are used to meet the costs of capital building and related costs. The responsibility for negotiating Attendance Dues lies with the Proprietor (Bishop Campbell in the case of St Peter's), and they are paid to him, not to the College. Attendance Dues for 2009 will be \$79.50 per term for Years 7 and 8 students, and \$157.50 per term for Years 9 – 13 students.

### **Activity Credit**

An Activity Credit of \$70 for a single student, \$100 for two students, or a maximum of \$120 for a family of three or more students, is requested. This contributes to the cost of some school activities, the College magazine, and for any other purpose the management shall decide is in the interests of the students. The credit is payable at the beginning of the year when stationery is issued and saves families being pestered for periodic sums of money. Families not paying the credit will be given the option to pay prior to activities occurring, or declining their child's involvement.

### **Stationery**

Stationery for students in Years 7-9 will be purchased by the school and for students in Years 10-13 stationery can be purchased on-line or bought locally. Lists will be in the end of year mail-out.

Details of requirements and subject charges for consumable items that become the property of the student will be supplied to parents prior to the end of this year. If surplus stationery is available, further supplies may be purchased from our Executive Officer during the year.

### **Bursaries**

There are several bursaries available for boarding students:

- **Boarding Bursaries** - of \$2725 a year for students who live more than 4.8 kilometres from the nearest state school or the nearest bus stop.
- **Technical Bursary** - of \$2725 a year for students in Years 10 and 11 who are not eligible for a Boarding Bursary and cannot obtain tuition in an agriculture or workshop subject at their local school.
- **Secondary Bursary** - of \$2725 a year for students who are in Year 12 or 13 and cannot obtain tuition in approved subjects at their local school.
- **Other bursaries** - there are other bursaries available and the Hostel Manager is happy to advise families of what they are entitled to.
- **Maori and Polynesian Bursaries** – there are a number of bursaries available including a distance bursary and a special needs bursary.
